Pike River: December 2017



It was a bit late in the season for this trip as the weather was hot, in the mid-30's during the day but luckily cooled down nicely at night. We had 7 people, meeting at the pump station opposite Simarloo station on Friday lunchtime (although some of us were late, I am blaming the roadworks).

Camp was reached by mid afternoon, and we had a relaxing afternoon after setting up the tents. The nice thing about Pike river is that you camp in the same place for both nights, and can leave the tents up.
